

# 2019 'HOSCARS': BEST HOSTELS FROM AROUND THE WORLD REVEALED

- Based on 1.2 million customer reviews submitted in the past 12 months, Hostelworld announces this year's winners with 310 hostels honoured across 29 categories
- With a 42% increase in solo travel bookings between 2015 and 2017, Hostelworld adds Best for Solo Travel category to celebrate hostels catering for solo travellers' needs

**LONDON**, **21**<sup>st</sup> **January 2019**: Hollywood's elite will learn if they're in the running for an Oscar tomorrow, but today it's time for hostels to take the spotlight with the launch of <u>Hostelworld's 2019 HOSCARs</u> (Hostelworld Customer Annual Ratings). Recognising the best in backpacker accommodation for globe trotters, this year's HOSCARs add a raft of new categories including Best for Pre-Uni Gap-Yearers and Best for Career Breakers.

Responding to the 42% boom in solo travel bookings, Hostelworld has also introduced the world's Best Hostels for Solo Travellers. The new category aims to celebrate the hostels that are committed to creating an environment where going-it-alone results in meeting like-minded people and having a once in a lifetime experience. The Roadhouse in Prague has been crowned the overall winner. With female solo bookings increasing 45%1, Hostelworld's users have called out We Love F. Tourists in Lisbon for being the top spot for female solo travellers.

It will come as no surprise that Brits in particular are getting their travel fix in sunnier climes. British travellers' top three hostels were all located in South East Asia: Cozy Nook Hostel in Vietnam, Lub D Cambodia Siem Reap in Cambodia and Stamps Backpackers in Thailand. Those searching for adventure elsewhere, can head here to find top-rated hostels from all around the world.

Reviews from 1.2 million customers, submitted over the past year, determined which of the 36,000 properties in over 170 countries would scoop a much-coveted HOSCAR. Reviews are based on key criteria including overall customer experience, value for money, security, location, atmosphere, staff, cleanliness and facilities.

The categories are broken down by continent, top 116 countries and top 50 cities, as well as a number of unique awards including Best Value for Money, Best Atmosphere, Best for Pre-Uni Gap-Yearers, Career Breakers and Best for Solo Travellers.

Best for Solo Travellers - The Roadhouse Prague, Czech Republic

Its big social areas help people meet like-minded travellers, making it a worthy winner of the new award for 2019. Staff also organise daily activities such as trips to local festivals, walking tours and bar tours, making it perfect for those travelling solo.

Best Solo Female Hostel – We Love F. Tourists, Portugal

Female solo travellers crowned the newly refurbished <u>We Love F. Tourists</u>, Lisbon, as the Best for Female Solo Travellers, thanks to its friendly staff who run daily activities. With Lisbon's reputation for being a safe, cultural, laid back, affordable and superbly located near amazing beaches, it's easy to see why female solo travellers find it an ideal location. The hostel says the F stands for many things such as 'finding', 'friendly', 'fun-loving', 'foreign' and 'funky', and Hostelworld users clearly think it can also stand for "female".

#### Best Solo Male Hostel - Hostel One Paralelo, Barcelona
