Wanggoobla Creek - Fraser Island, Australia

Winding through the rainforest on this small but beautiful island, Wanggobla Creek boasts white sands and clear, icy waters. It's less famous than Eli Creek, so if you're looking for somewhere a little more off the beaten track then this will be right up your street.

Black's Beach – La Jolla, San Diego, CA

Samurai Beach - Port Stephens, Australia

Bellevue Beach - Copenhagen, Denmark
