Nusa Penida is the Number One Travel Destination for 2020

Hostelworld Reveals Key 2020 Travel Spots for Brits

- Bookings to Nusa Penida have increased by 610% in the last 12 months, crowning the
 Indonesian island as the most desired destination
- South East Asia sees a huge spike with locations in Indonesia, Thailand, the Philippines and Vietnam making up the top five

13 November, London: Nusa Penida, Indonesia, has been revealed as the number one travel destination for 2020 by <u>Hostelworld</u>, the global hostel-focussed online booking platform, which has revealed an increase in Brit bookings of 610% year on year.

Located to the South East of Bali, Nusa Penida is popular for both passing visits via speedboat and dedicated stays. The biggest and most remote of the three Nusa islands, Nusa Penida has shot to fame thanks to its coastal cliffscape in the shape of Tyrannosaurus Rex at Kelingking Secret Point Beach. This beautiful island is perfect for travellers looking to experience a slower rhythm of life. For nature lovers, the island boasts one of the best places in the world to see Manta Rays, as well as a sanctuary home to the iconic Bali starling (locally known as jalak Bali) – once thought to be completely extinct in the wild.

The Thai city of Surat Thani comes in second place. Its name, which means the 'City of Good People', was given to the city by King Vajiravudh in 1915 and is a recognised Thai travel hub. Known for its easy access to both mainland Thailand and its striking islands, Surat Thani is enjoying the spotlight as guests partake in short stays before travelling on to

the party favourites. With an increase of 256% year on year, the destination offers travellers the opportunity to experience the culture of a real Thai working city, wonderful southern street food, gorgeous derelict beaches and beautifully coloured Chinese temples.

In third place is Siargao Island, a stunning island in the Philippines, which was voted the best island in the world by *Condé Nast Traveller*¹ readers earlier this year. The tear-drop shaped island has seen an increase of 181% as Brits recognise the benefits from stunning white sand beaches and peaceful forests, with a remote, untouched feel of paradise.

Other key top 20 trending travel destinations to see their numbers of bookings more than double include Ha Giang (118%) and Phong Nha (104%) in Vietnam, as well as Kuta Lombok in Indonesia (107.5%), demonstrating the desire for long-haul adventure by young travellers.
